This is a short break down on what we have done recently —

Mental health assessments

We continue to attend mental health assessments in order to assist doctors in order to ensure that everything that takes place during the assessment is legal and proportionate.

If you know someone or are someone in need of help with their mental health, call 101, or 111 for medical.

Community protection warning & notices (CPW&CPN's)

Once again more CPW's have been issued followed by a CPN these warnings are a way to deal with ASB in set areas. CPW/CPN has conditions (e.g. Not to attend locations or gather large amounts of property to store on a public foot path) that if not followed then a CPN community protection notice is obtained and issued.

If then not followed it can leave the person liable for arrest.

Backfilling for ERPT (Emergency Response Policing Team)

Due to mass training for officers on ERPT in order to keep their skills honed SNT have been taking their places on ERPT responding to 999 calls, this is not only essential to maintain the number of officers responding at a satisfactory level but also a great way for SNT officers to continue to stay familiar with the BCU as a whole and refresh their skills of dealing with different situations that they may face when responding to calls.



General patrol

Patrol of the ward is always the best way to see the ward in all its glory, speaking with shop workers residents and passers through. When on patrol SNT officers often visit victims for reassurance checks and local businesses to be aware of any ongoing incidents in the locality in which hasn't been reported.

How to report..

How and what to report to emergency services — On speaking to some residents it has become apparent that not everyone knows how or what to report.

Things you can report and how —

- Non emergency neighbour disputes **(101)**
- Suspicious activity **(101 or Foresthill.snt@met.police.uk)**
- Non emergency police **(101)**
- Emergency's **(999)**
- Mental health episodes **(999)**
- Non emergency medical **(111)**

If concerned, report.

Ward Panel..

Ward Panel Meetings — Due to the lack of attendees of the ward panel over the last few months. **The ward panel will now be joint with PERRY VALE's ward panel.** This is a temporary trial and will be taking place in MAY at St GEORGE'S Church WOOLSTONE/VANCOVER ROAD.

Ward panels are where police and residents talk about priority issues within the ward hosted by the Chair.

Currently our Ward priorities are

1. Increasing Police presence in the ward and reducing drug dealing/use within town centres.
2. Reducing car crime including tool theft.
3. Reducing burglary's helping residents to protect themselves.

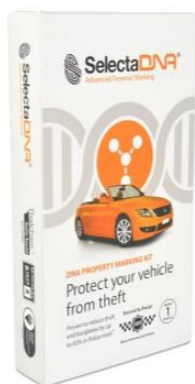

Motor vehicle crime awareness



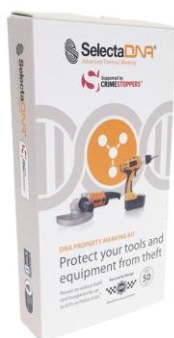
We still offer vehicle marking

We have received multiple emails regarding vehicle marking. Although we haven't attended addresses yet to mark vehicles we are ready to do so.. Weather dependent.

Vehicle window etching — Glass etching with unique codes to individual pack that is issued.

Security stickers —Special security stickers that we place on the engine or chassis out of sight this sticker cannot be removed easily and leaves a mark.

Visible security stickers —These stickers can be put as a visible deterrent against vehicle thieves. Placed inside and easy to remove in case you no longer want it on show.



DNA marking drops —These drops can be applied via the applicator which is a clear dot barely visible to any device or property which has unique DNA assigned to individual packs. This is good for laptops or any high value property.

Information —Security information for your vehicle such as steering wheel locks and pedal locks ghost immobilizers and faraday pouches.

Tool marking kits —Much like the DNA marking drops specifically designed for tools.

Usually £60 but were giving them away for free!

HOW IT WORKS



Step 1

Use SelectaDNA to mark and protect your property



Step 2

Put signs up to show that your home or business is protected



Step 3

Register your unique DNA code on our secure database

Due to the limited number of vehicle kits we have we have had to target a certain criteria of vehicles this is if your car was made in 2019 onwards or if it is a luxury vehicle.

We hope to continue these a events and with time open up the eligibility to everyone.

Tool Marking

Why YOU should use tool marking..

- Tool marking is a simple and effective way to insure your tools can be identified and linked to you.
- The marking solution is a unique DNA to the specific kit and once applied will dry clear but glow under UV light.
- Not only is applying the DNA marking to tools or other items very quick and easy to do but registering your tools online takes a couple of minutes and is equally as simple.

Why WE want use tool marking..

Tool theft is often unpredictable and a spur of the moment type theft. Marking your tools insure that if these tools are ever found on someone, in someone's vehicle, at a car boot sale, or found in a raid they can be easily identified not only returned to the original owner but it also proves that they belong to another thus giving further evidence to convict the seller of handling stolen goods or theft.

When/where we are marking tools..

We have been attending local building merchants and giving these kits to customers provided they sign up.

Updates from Forest Hill SNT

ASB— ASB is a persistent concern of Forest Hill SNT. ASB not only causes issues for individuals but the residents and anyone who is in the ward. To deal with ASB Forest Hill SNT often problem solve themselves, contacting Lewisham council or housing. CPW's CPN's and community resolutions. We are aware of ongoing problems on the main high street and are working towards solving these issues with help from the council and agencies.

SNT Vehicles— Reminder that SNT do not have assigned marked police vehicles instead have access to a un-marked regular cars. On occasion we will be out in a marked carrier performing proactive patrols.

Events / School visits — Forest Hill SNT is open to welcoming ideas for events or visits to schools if requested.

Street Meets — Forest Hill SNT will be conducting street meets where officers will be posted at a location to answer any questions that residents or members of the public have.

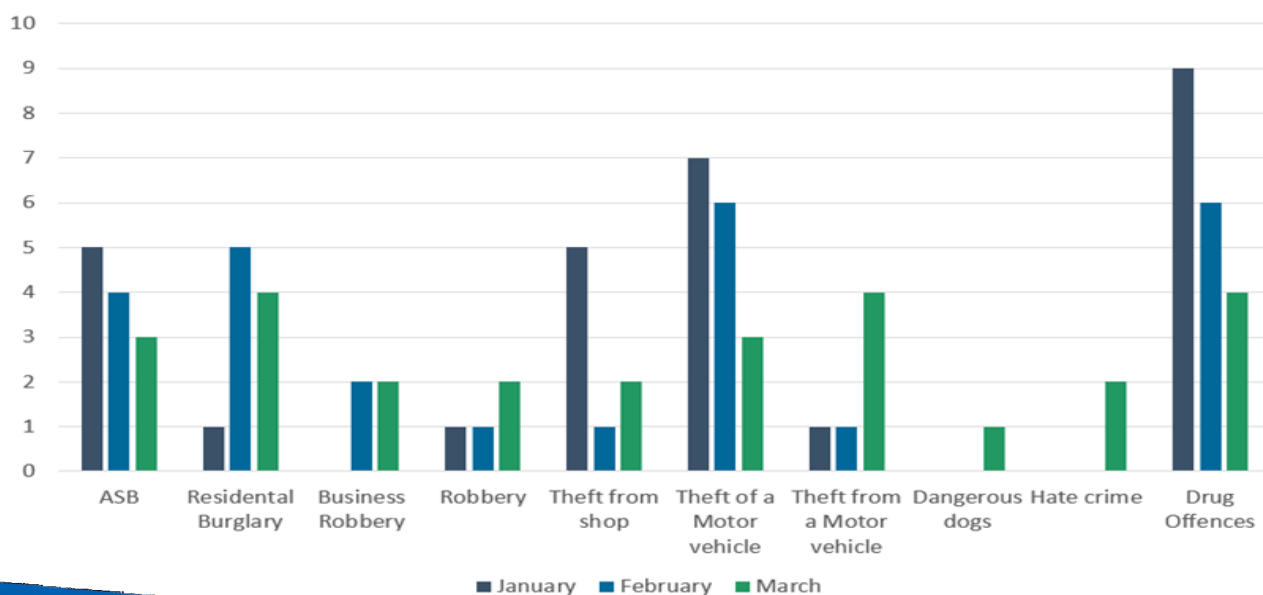
Crime stats within FOREST HILL

The MET ride along scheme

The Met Police ride along scheme offers individuals the chance to join officers on patrol and gain an insight into daily policing.

The scheme has been brought back under The New Met for London which focuses on more trust, less crime and higher standards.

You can choose to ride with the following units:

Emergency Response Team—These officers attended emergency calls (e.g assaults, robberies).



Who can apply and what to expect

- ◆ You have to be 18 and over and live in London to be applicable to applicable to apply.
- ◆ You will be subjected to a criminal check record. Having a previous conviction does not necessarily mean your application will be rejected. The Met review each application on a case by case basis.
- ◆ On the day you will be asked to sign a confidentiality agreement and participant briefing sheet.
- ◆ You will get the unique opportunity to talk to officers on a one-to-one basis and gain better knowledge on how the Met police.
- ◆ Please note—due to high influx of applications for this scheme, it can take up to four weeks for the Met to get back to you in relation to your application.

STREET MEET'S

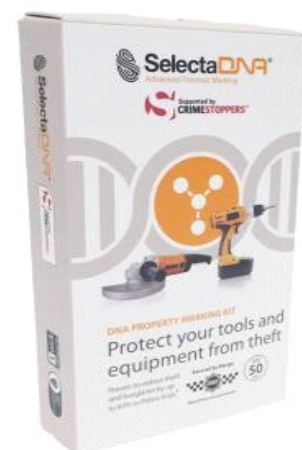
Forest Hill SNT will be holding 'Street meets' once per month in which a police community engagement van will be parking up at various places around Forest Hill in order to engage with the public allowing residents to speak to us face to face and gain any advice we can give them regarding any of their concerns of the local area. This is also the perfect opportunity for you to give us any information or intel regarding issues on the ward.

Along with crime prevention advice leaflets we will be handing out the tool marking kits to trades workers which usually cost £60 but we provide them for free!

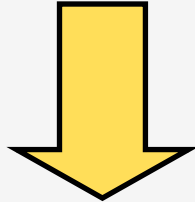
These kits are designed with unique DNA marking so that if the worst were to happen, the tools can be identified and returned to their owner along with providing evidence that they are stolen to allow us a prosecution.

What is tool marking?

Tool marking with SelectaDNA involves applying a unique, invisible paint with a code to your tools. This makes them traceable if stolen, increasing the chances of recovery and deterring thieves.

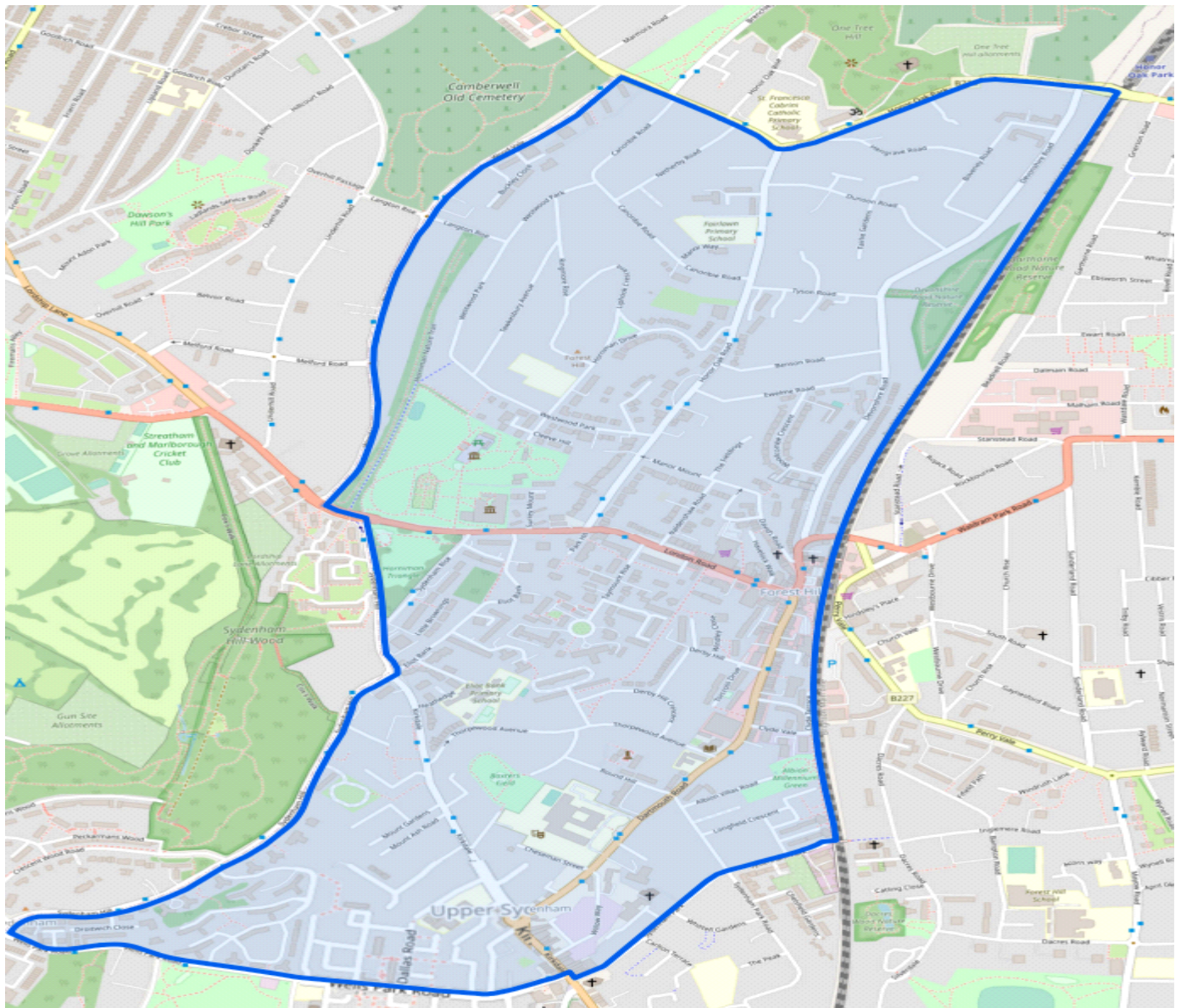
